FATHER HUBER ASSEMBLY 809 BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES FOR OCT. 21, 2004

Faithful Navigator Jesus Garcia called the meeting to order at 8:17 p.m.

Roll Call of the officers – present and excused: Faithful Friar, Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Pilot, Faithful Scribe, Faithful Comptroller, Faithful Purser, Faithful Admiral, Inner Sentinel, Outer Sentinel, 2nd year Trustee, 3rd year Trustee, Faithful Commander

Reading of Minutes: A survey of Knights attending the meeting was made to ensure that everyone had received last month's Minutes. It was found that all had and the floor was opened for corrections or changes to the minutes. Since none were proposed, a motion was made to accept the minutes as printed. This was seconded. No discussion followed and the motion was approved.

Faithful Friar's Report: Father Bakle has been and still is in the process of moving to Christ the King. He has also been very busy dealing with issues arising from the arson on the west side. This has included counseling those suffering losses from the arson as well as dealing with various local, state and federal officials investigating the arson. A lot of racism issues have also arisen, and we should keep this whole situation in our prayers and offer any help we can. We are getting a new Bishop; his ordination should probably be coming up before Christmas time. It is probable that the 4th degree will be very involved. He was the auxiliary Bishop in Minneapolis, St Paul and was made Bishop in 1999. Protégé of Current Archbishop. Expect him to be a Bishop very much like Bishop Herman. He was a delayed vocation and came to Ohio State and received two Graduate Degrees in History, then was a laymen teacher at the Josephinum, then taught at a secular college out in California. He was nearly forty year old when he entered the seminary, so he has lots of life experience. He is expected to be a very Pastoral Bishop and a blessing to this Diocese. The elections are about here and we should all participate in these elections. Visit the American Bishops web site that is called Faithful citizenship. We should also be a bit critical of some of our Bishops that seem to cross the line of moral authority and pressure people to vote one way or the other. Be informed and vote for the good of our country.

Provincial weekend: It was a bittersweet weekend for those attending. Brother Sir Knight Dave Core and his family were heavy on their minds and hearts and they basically wanted to skip the weekend, but Dave Core was mentioned numerous times and they made sure that he was remembered.

- Jesse wanted to thank everyone that showed up for Dave's wake and funeral, it was kind of a mess with the Officers out of town, and a last minute change of plans on when our ceremony would be held. It worked out, we had a great turn out for the early and late sessions and at the funeral. Jesse personally wished Dave were with us now, but he's in a better place. We need to say prayers for Charlene and the family, and that Charlene doesn't stay away that long. All were invited to rise and share a moment of silence in memoriam of Dave.
- Jesse showed off the Hardware that we received at Provincial, it is a tribute to the work of our Assembly. We received a certificate for 168% of membership goals, we also received the plaque for highest recruiting at 46 new members and we also were one (1) of two (2) Assemblies that participated in the RSVP program.
- We are in the process of tracking down Bishop Campbell's status in the Knights. Currently, we don't know. If he is a Knight at this time, we will offer him an invitation to join our Assembly.

Reading of Bills and Communications:

- We sent a personal invitation to Bishop Griffin inviting him to attend our meetings and asked if he needs any assistance from us as well as offered him our best wishes.
- We received notice that our Faithful Master Richard Wysong has been re-elected for the next two years.
