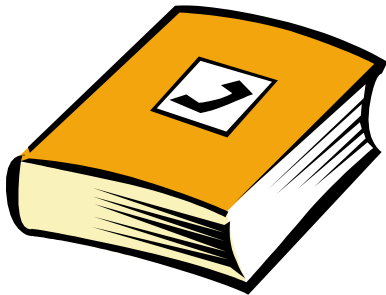
REMEMBER: * The 3rd Thursday of each month is the Social and Business meeting of the Assembly.
