- The actual business meeting will be reconvened at 8:00 p.m. and we will announce the new officers prior to the closing of the meeting.

- The three (3) official delegates for the Biennial District Assembly meeting will be voted on at the April 15th business meeting. This voting was over looked at the March 18th business meeting. **Sorry for the oversight.**

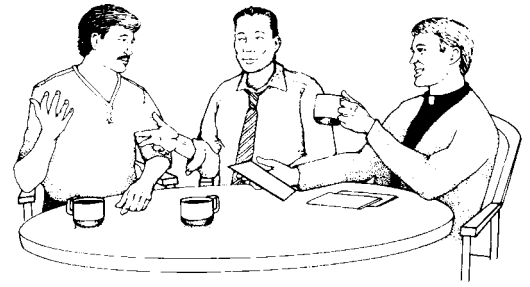
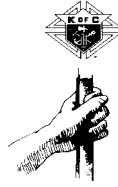

MINUTES OF THE FATHER HUBER ASSEMBLY 809 BUSINESS MEETING FOR 18 MARCH 2004

Faithful Navigator Frank Polczynski called the meeting to order at 7:52 pm. The meeting was opened at 7:57 pm.

Roll call of the Officers. (present and excused): F. Friar (ex), F. Navigator, F. Captain, F. Pilot (ex, SK R. Blamer sub.), F. Scribe, F. Comptroller (ex, SK D. Core sub.), F. Purser, F. Admiral, Inner Sentinel, Outer Sentinel, 2nd Yr. Trustee, 3rd Yr. Trustee

The Faithful Navigator made a motion, " that if the minutes are correct as written, to dispense with the reading of the minutes". The motion was seconded and approved.

Reading of the bills: (Dave Core)

- Dave Core (newsletter) \$87.80

F. Navigators Report:

- **Chalices:** Frank will have a chalice engraved for newly deceased SK Al Muth. Then the chalice will be shown to his daughter and then given to Fr. Bakle for disposition.
- SK Dave Core said Fr. Thomas Cadden of this Assembly also died recently. Frank asked if we should prepare a chalice for a deceased priest. A statement was made from the floor that the priests pay into the chalice fund, so they should also have a chalice engraved with their name and disposed of in the prescribed manor set by their directive or the Assembly. Frank said he will check with Supreme but, in the interim, he will have a chalice engraved with Fr. Thomas' name and give to Fr. Bakle for disposition. Fr. Cadden had no directive.
- **Papal Flag:** Frank has met and spoken with Bishop Griffin about the Papal flag. Bishop Griffin told Frank to write a letter to Supreme, which he has done, to get the guidelines required to make sure the flag is displayed properly. Once Frank receives the written response from Supreme, he will present that response to Bishop Griffin so that he may make a decision and give the Assembly an answer as to the disposition of a Papal flag.
- **New Members:** Frank said today is the last day for turning in applications for new members for the Exemplification. Turn in any ads and form 400's you may have. SK's Joe Rossi and Greg Kostelac will give a report on where we stand at this time in regards to the Exempt.
- **PFN Dinner:** F. Captain Jesse Garcia will give the status of the PFN dinner.
- **Confirmations:** Frank commented about the showing of SK's that Assembly 809 has provided for the recent confirmations, compared to the other assemblies. He asked for more participation and said the Bishop has acknowledged his appreciation for the SK's that have shown up.
- **Introduction of New Applicants:** Frank gave a brief talk of how we will finish the business portion of tonight's meeting and then bring in the new candidates for introductions. No business will be brought up from that point on. The drawing for the flag and closing of the meeting will follow the introductions.
- **Memorial Name plaque:** Frank has received a couple of calls from relatives of deceased SK's who have asked why their husband/relative's name, that was paid for, is not on the memorial plaque. Frank stressed the importance of expediting this procedure and urged those responsible to do so. It was also pointed out that \$50.00 or the donation of the cape and chapeaux, of the deceased SK, may be made to the Assembly for the cost of adding the SK's name to the memorial plaque at the Cathedral.

- Ladies brunch will begin at 10:00 am

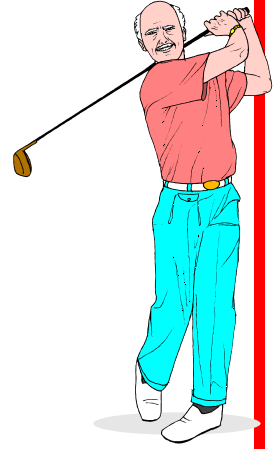
