The directory is in the planning stages and hopefully it will generate some revenue, but is not a guaranteed thing. Monte Carlo: Here is a guaranteed money-maker and only one night's (Knight's!) work. Think about it. All we need is a location, the equipment is easily acquired and for about 6 hours worth of work ... money is raised! Let me know if you'd be interested in running this.

Assembly Directory: This could be a nice little project and it's a two-fold one ... everyone would get current information on the membership and it could generate some funds through the selling of ads.

Exemplification program book: This is a biggie. Remember the ads save us money, if we sell enough ads, the Captain's room is paid for by the exemplification committee and the Assembly doesn't have to foot the bill for the weekend. So I'll ask each of you to go back to your council and make sure that they at least place a half page ad, especially if you have candidates joining the Assembly.

A special mention should go to the women of the Assembly. Last year they "saved us" with their Auction, since the Pig Roast was a bomb.

Remember this, fellow Sir Knights. Each one of us is responsible for our Assembly. We can continue to rebuild and get things back to where they were or we can let it sink.

- **Sunday, August 29th, Fifth Sunday Mass at OLPH. Knights in regalia are ask to attend.**



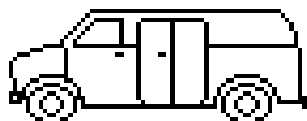
A SPECIAL THANK YOU FROM LADY JEAN BALES

This year the Faithful Navigator asked to send the following: Faithful Captain, Faithful Pilot and the Faithful Commander. A motion was made and seconded to do so. During the discussion, it was suggested that we could afford to send 4 so we should included the Faithful Navigator too. The motion was amended and passed.

Fund Raising: At this time we have no fund raising events scheduled:

Golf Tournament: I am looking for a chairperson for the event, if no one shows an interest, then this activity will be dropped. Assembly directory: An idea that was tossed about at the Officers' meeting was to develop an Assembly Directory (address book). This would be a comprehensive listing of our membership and requires ads be sold to cover the printing costs. The last Time a Directory was published was 1993. Seek to sell 3x the number of ads in last directory. Directory will be full letter size folded out, full page ad \$100 estimated, 1/2 page \$50 estimated, business card size \$25. Larry James will chair this. Goal is to sell minimum \$5,000 in ads. He invites member businesses to place ads. It will be mailed out to every member of assembly. No motion was made until costs and other information could be provided.
