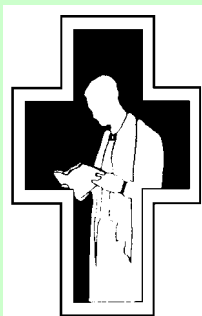

MINUTES OF THE FATHER HUBER ASSEMBLY 809 BUSINESS MEETING FOR 15 APRIL 2004

Faithful Navigator Frank Polczynski called the meeting to order at 8:01 pm. The meeting was opened at 8:10 pm.

Roll call of the Officers. (present and excused): F. Friar (ex), F. Navigator, F. Captain, F. Pilot, F. Scribe, F. Comptroller (ex), F. Purser, F. Admiral (ex, F. Iannaggi sub) Inner Sentinel, Outer Sentinel, 2nd Yr. Trustee, 3rd Yr. Trustee

The Faithful Navigator made a motion, "that if the minutes are correct as written, to dispense with the reading of the minutes". The motion was seconded and approved.

Reading of the bills: No reading

F. Navigators Report:

- **Meeting on 20 May 2004:** **That** Thursday is also the celebration of the "Ascension of the Lord". That Holy Day of Obligation is being transferred to Sunday, May 23. So the business meeting of Assembly 809 will take place on the regularly scheduled day.

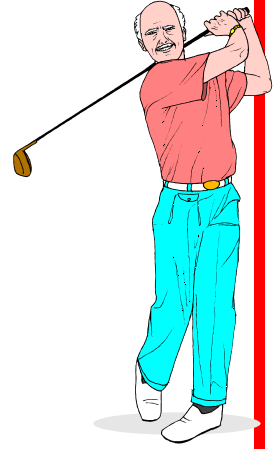

At our last Assembly meeting we prayed for someone having a cat-scan. We now have the results in a message from Lady Teresa. Please keep Frank and Teresa Iannaggi in your thoughts and prayers.

Subject: Frank's cat-scan results

I know that Frank won't probably tell anyone what is happening, you know how he is. But, I feel the more prayers that are said the better things will be.

Our family doctor received the cat-scan results today and has referred Frank to a Lung Specialist. His appointment is Thursday, April 29 at 10:30 a.m.

The description was a mass that appears to be encapsulated.

I have looked up information about Histoplasmosis and can't get a description of what it would look like in a lung scan. A man I work with said his daughter's was a tennis ball size growth that they removed the fluid from and inside was a golf ball size mass of the fungus. To me this sounds like encapsulation. Histoplasmosis is very treatable in 90% of the cases, so I like the odds if this is what it could be.

Unfortunately Frank is very bummed about more waiting, and not knowing. Someone else said the fact that they are sending him to a lung specialist and not an oncologist could mean that they are pretty sure it is not cancer. And that is one hope I am definitely clinging to.
