FATHER HUBER ASSEMBLY 809 BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES FOR Sept. 16, 2004

Faithful Navigator Jesus Garcia called the meeting to order at 8:12 p.m.

Roll call of the officers-- present and excused: Faithful Friar, Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Pilot, Faithful Scribe, Faithful Comptroller, Faithful Purser, Faithful Admiral, Inner Sentinel, Outer Sentinel, 2nd year Trustee, 3rd year Trustee, Faithful Commander

Reading of the Minutes: A correction was made to the newsletter. Brett Baxter's phone number was corrected to 868-8046. Motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes. It was seconded and passed.

Faithful Friar's Report: No Report

Faithful Navigator's Report:

- **Budget:** The proposed budget was mailed/e-mailed to you hopefully you have reviewed it. In meeting with the officers it was decided that we would show the budget in terms of monies that are/were collected and paid out on a regular basis. As a point of order, a budget is not required by Supreme, the Hennepin District or even by the Chapter. We do it as a way of tracking our incoming and outgoing money. Questions on the budget were addressed and explained. Questions on overspending on the Chalice fund were brought up and it was mentioned that we may in the future have to pay for engraving as that is currently being done by a member at no charge and most of our shipping has been taken care of by Father Bakle. In response to that and other questions on Chalice fund needs and spending it was noted that the current \$5.00/yr fee is not a fixed amount and it can, and has in the past, been adjusted to compensate for years of greater than normal need. It was also suggested that if we have an uncommitted Chalice the VA hospital is in need of a new Chalice. It was suggested that we inform Father Bakle of this as he is always looking for Suggestions on where to send Chalices that are not donated to a specific place or person.
- This spending plan does not show any extra curricular events such as RSVP, Parades, Keep Christ in Christmas billboards and other "council type programs." It also doesn't show fund raisers.
- We could discuss this issue all night, so this is what is being presented: the only item that needs to be addressed is the cost of the newsletter printing and we will address that later under old business.

Reading of Bills and Communications:

- Received Provincial meeting final notice, (slated for October 1-3, 2004) in Perrysburg, Ohio.
- Commercial Insurance Policy for Liability Insurance - \$250.00 for \$1,000,000 per occurrence also includes \$25.00 service charge for terrorism coverage.
- 3 months of newsletter expenses- totaling \$320.06.
- Motion was made to pay our bills. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

- October Top of the Month dinner will be on Mon., Oct. 4th at P.K.O'Ryans on High St. in Worthington. The Tri-assembly dinner will be on Mon. Nov. 1 at the Ohio State University Golf Club. Cocktails at 6:30 Dinner at 7:00. Dress is Formal, and Cost is \$21.00 per person. It is hoped that there will be better turn-outs for future Top of the Month Dinners as the last was attended by only 2 couples and we reserve room for many more, which is a great inconvenience for the restaurant and defeats the social purpose of the event.

- Nov. 10th - Veterans' Day Parade. Pilot will not be there but Regalia will be available.
- Nov. 11 - Flag Disposal Ceremony - Will be at Dusk in Civic Park in Reynoldsburg.
- Nov. 21st - Memorial Mass Honoring our departed Brother Knights.

Vote Posters came in and are available for members to use at their Churches. \$105.00 came in on Chalice fund.

Faithful Scribe's Report - Directives are available on line and I encourage anyone who hasn't completed one yet to do so. I will also have directives available at each meeting for those who do not have computer access.

Faithful Commander's Report - Received new regalia and has already been put into service. Very Nice.

By-Law Committee - Still in the review Process.

Reading of Applications: 1 application for new member - Steven Barker born in 1966, member of 5253 — sponsor is Jerry Lowry II.

Unfinished Business:

- **Newsletter:** The Newsletter has been printed free of charge by St. Pius and Church of Our Lady in the past. To print it with a professional printer, it would cost \$1632.00 per year to print/mail. Church of Our Lady would allow us to continue to use their copy machine for an annual donation of \$500.00 We have been told that C.O.O.L. will accept a \$500.00 donation/year to allow us to continue printing there. This donation will save us \$357.00 per year, immediately. A motion was made to approve this expenditure, was seconded and passed..
- **Veterans Day Parade.** November 10, 2004 - Assembly 2727 has approved \$200.00 toward the parade, so we are now looking for \$350.00 funding for the Parade. To correct the misinformation that was stated at the last meeting, this donation would be to MilVets organization and not to the Mayor's office. The Mayor's office is a supporter of the parade, but funding and organizing is done by the MilVets. The money we donate helps provide support for scholarships for children of Veterans. A hard copy of the MilVets Powerpoint presentation on being a Corporate sponsor was handed out and discussions ensued. A motion was made to support the parade as a corporate sponsor by donating \$350.00 giving us greater visibility as an organization and supporting the parade. The motion was seconded and the floor was opened for discussion. It was brought into question the need for us to donate this money here as opposed to some other project, or a direct donation to the Veterans, as we would be eligible to participate in the parade in any event. The motion was tabled until further information about MilVets and what our sponsorship money is collected for.
- **Flag Disposal Ceremony:** November 11, 2004 -Civic Park Reynoldsburg Fletcher Hastings is making contact with Boy Scouts. A message will be written for the newsletter to invite all to bring their old flags for disposal. A Ceremonial flag burning will be followed by a mass burning, as we are expecting over 300 flags. Local newspaper coverage is also being sought. The event will be in Full Regalia.
- **Fund Raising:**
 1. **Assembly Directory** - We are in the early stages of development of the Assembly directory. Have put together a pricing scheme and made a presentation scheme. Have found a printer who will print it for advertising. Looking for people to sell the ads. Type will be larger for those with poor eyesight. Addresses and phone numbers will be checked and corrected as needed. The time line for completion is still being completed.
 2. **Monte Carlo:** - We are in negotiation with Christ the King to help sponsor a Monte Carlo night. Mark Borys has approached Father Trainer at Christ the King, we will be assisting the new council with their first major fund raiser. So we will be splitting the proceeds from this 60/40 (based on \$2200 that would come to \$800) The Knights have been contacted but we still need approval from Monsignor Trainer
