#### Defining who we are ... part one:

Recalling the events of the last meeting, we have to figure out our purpose in life. While we all know that the Fourth Degree is the ceremonial arm of the Knights of Columbus and our highest order, we still need to ask who are we and what is our purpose.

This is taken from the Supreme website and offers a glimpse of who we are:

"... The Fourth Degree imparts a lesson on the virtue of patriotism. The primary purpose of this degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large and encourage active Catholic citizenship..."

So we are chartered to impart the lessons of patriotism. So what is patriotism? The Merriam-Webster On-line dictionary has it defined as follows:

**"Pa tri-ot-ism; noun; love for or devotion to one's country"**

I think I can safely say that we love and are all devoted to this country (if not, we have to talk) and likewise we are devoted to the Fourth Degree, or why else would we have joined?

Then you have to ask what are we supposed to be doing?

One answer to that is that we are supposed to be in the parades and wakes (when asked), we are supposed to be with the Bishop (when requested), we are supposed to be at the first communions and confirmations (when invited) and we are supposed to be highly visible when it is appropriate to be.

Another answer could be that we act like a Council and run the "Council Programs" that are available to us (RSVP, Knight and Family of the Year, etc.)

The former is easy, we just show up when asked, Period. It doesn't cost money, just time. But time is important because everyone is busy and some are not willing to stop what they are doing and show up for the parade, wake, first communion or confirmation.

The latter requires us to work and some of us are not willing to do that either. We will sit at the meeting and complain that everyone wants us to pony up money for things, (Veteran's Day Parade, Keep Christ in Christmas billboards, RSVP, TV Mass, etc., etc. etc) but when you ask for participation in the fund raiser ... well now that's a different story.

Now if you want the classic example of this, then look no further than the Fr. Huber Golf Outing; what an easy way to make money, yet we couldn't even go back to our respective councils and get people to participate (golf or ad sign). We should have been turning people away, not begging for teams to show up.

Another example is the Exemplification Ad book, we are fortunate to have an inside scoop on this, but we could do better. We have about 47 councils that are represented in our Assembly, yet only 12 Council's (27%) took out ads last year. The money that we get in these ads offsets our Exemplification costs.

So now we have to figure our purpose ...

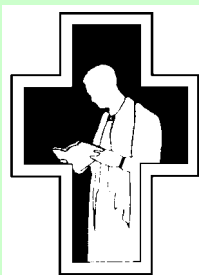

## FATHER HUBER ASSEMBLY 809 BUSINESS MEETING FOR AUGUST 19, 2004

Faithful Navigator Jesus Garcia called the meeting to order at 8:15 p.m.

Roll call of the officers present and excused: Faithful Friar, Faithful Navigator, Faithful Captain, Faithful Pilot, Faithful Scribe, Faithful Comptroller, Faithful, Purser, Faithful Admiral, Inner Sentinel, Outer Sentinel, 1<sup>st</sup> year Trustee, 3<sup>rd</sup> year Trustee

Reading of the Minutes: Motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes. It was seconded and passed.

Faithful Friar's Report: No Report

Faithful Navigator's Report:

- Installation of Officers: was Held August 17<sup>th</sup> after the 5:00 pm Mass at St. John the Baptist Church. This was a very well attended event. Dinner followed and over 60 SK and wives attended. Cooperation between Assemblies was very good.
- Audit: Faithful Navigator met with the Trustees and they reviewed the books for the upcoming year and would like to thank Mark and Larry for working to get that out. It was actually sent in ahead of schedule
- Budget: The proposed budget was given to you as you entered the room. It was reviewed and the floor was opened for recommendations. Several changes were recommended. It was noted that, without fund raisers, the budget didn't allow for any unplanned expenses, including many being proposed tonight. The budget is made to reflect fixed income and expenses but to insure there are sufficient funds. The Officers plan to have a meeting to review the budget and the proposed changes so that they may further refine the budget.
- Joint Ventures: The Faithful Navigator has been in contact with Assemblies 2380 and 2727 and if the officers haven't received the newsletters from the other two Assemblies, they will. In an effort to get better cooperation we are going to try to work together more than we have in recent years. We will continue to focus on our own Assembly but it is important that we work together to accomplish many of the Master's goals. An example of this is the Bishop's Anniversary last Tuesday.
- Knights are needed to participate in the Family Rosary Day at Christ the King on Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup>, the first Sunday in Oct. The goal is to have at least 40 Sir Knights in attendance. The other two Assemblies have also been notified.
- On Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> we will need Sir Knights in Regalia for the Bishop's Mass to recruit Protestant ministers. This will be across the street from the Josephinum. The address will also be put into the calendar. See Frank Iannaggi for details.

Reading of Bills and Communications:

- We received the first notice of the Provincial meeting, slated for October 1-3, 2004 in Perrysburg, Ohio. Though this didn't affect us, the information contained in the notice was incorrect.
- We received a Thank You note from the Master, thanking us for the hospitality at the installation of officers.

Larry Bales - 3 names in on nameplate - 180.00 price up to 60.00 from 50.00  
Provincial - 10 people - 320.00 Bills were approved
- Faithful Captain's Report: - Next TOTM (Top of the Month dinner) will be on Tue. Sept. 7<sup>th</sup> because of Labor Day the day before. The Restaurant will be TAT restaurant on the corner of Livingston Ave & James Rd. Meeting next month will be salads — any at all. For Oct. 4th: Top of Month Dinner will be at P.K. O'Ryans on High St. and for the meeting the theme will be apples and pumpkin, anything made with apples or pumpkin will be acceptable. Deadline for newsletter will be next Wed. the 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Faithful Pilot's Report. - No Report but did find all Capes Chapeaus and Baldrics.
- Faithful Admiral's Report - 2 New Transfers: from St. Louis — Carl Polito, and Theodore Johnson from 238 Richmond IN.
- Faithful Comptroller's Report. - 330 Members— last month, 1 transfer out. 2 Deaths- Joe Roberts and George Kaltenecker. Received honorary membership card for Claude Dixon. Sent out bills first of this month for outstanding dues and fees. Received 5 honorary members' checks for Chalice funds. Outstanding dues- \$815.00 against Chalice funds. Includes Priests which we do not bill but we do encourage Councils or members to pay for their Priests' Chalice Fund. We are ordering Flags and Vote Posters this month.

- **Calendar:** - I hope everyone saw the calendar for Aug. It does give you plenty of space to jot down any last minute events
- **Reading of Applications:** Dean Clark from Christ the King. and Nicklaus Rehl from Christ the King.
- **Trustee Report:** Trustees did review the Audit and found everything in order.

#### Unfinished Business:

- **Calling Tree** - Still looking for representatives from each of the feeder Councils to help the Faithful Inner and Outer Sentinels make calls for wakes or regalia functions. This will be one of those volunteer or be volunteered deals... a copy of the members' numbers will be supplied to the representative.
- **A Motion** was made at the July meeting by SK Ralph Blamer (2nd by Joe Rossi) to replace the Officer Jewels of the Assembly and update the inscription to our current name. The Cost is \$350.00. The Discussion was reopened and the motion was passed.
- **A Motion** was made to donate the old Jewels to a museum being organized by Fr. Lutz, since we are the oldest assembly in the City. The motion was passed.
- **Circleville Pumpkin Show is October 22, 2004:** please mark it on your calendar to attend.
- **Veterans' Day Parade is November 10, 2004.** We are looking for \$500.00 funding for the Parade. I was approached after last month's meeting that if we were to raise \$500.00, a matching \$500.00 would be available. We would like to donate a minimum of \$1000 to help support the parade and get us a better position in the parade. We would like suggestions to how to raise the \$500. A pass the hat match my donation option was mentioned.
- **Flag Disposal Ceremony - November 11<sup>th</sup> 2004.** Fletcher Hastings has volunteered to head that venture and he could use volunteers to help. He will pick up ceremonials from Veterans Association. The Fire Academy was recommended to honor our Fireman and country. This is being looked into by Bret Baxter.
- **Fund Raisers-** A web sight was recommended but as of now no fund raisers are proposed. The Directory was proposed again and the total costs and income is being looked into. Volunteers are being gathered as well.
- **A Monte Carlo** was mentioned but a date and location is needed. Equipment is available. We could expect about \$3,500 in income from a Monte Carlo event based on 'Seton Parish' experience.
- **Provincial Ad** - passed ad around for review. If we can get at least 6 pages of ads, the Assembly will get a rebate of 20.00.
- Ad prices full page - \$110.00, ½ page - \$60.00. 1/4 page - \$35.00.
- **Knights are needed in full Regalia at Our Lady of Guadalupe and Santa Cruz** to help with the formation of a Spanish Council, on Dec. 12 between 11:30 and 12:00 for 12:30 Mass.
- **The Chapter is looking to put up at least 3 more bill boards** and is looking for Assemblies to sponsor the billboards. Frank Iannaggi asked that we consider sponsoring one, which would help meet our Diocesan obligations.
- **The 2<sup>nd</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> degree team** could use more members. They currently undertake 10 - 12 degrees a year. This is a very rewarding activity.
- **We have an opportunity** to participate in Feed My Sheep by sponsoring the Benevolence Restaurant to feed the poor in either March or April. A \$200.00 recommendation was made.
- **All the District Deputies have distributed Vote poster to all of the Councils.** Voter Registration material is also available if a Council wishes to register voters at their Parish.

#### New Business:

- **A Motion** was made to approve the purchase of new Regalia for the Commander. Regalia consist of Cape, Chapeau and cover for \$212.50 plus shipping and handling. The motion was seconded and was approved.
- **The Newsletter has \$775.00 in the budget for postage.** The Newsletter has been printed free of charge by St Pius and Church of Our Lady. To print it with a professional printer it would cost \$1650.00 per year to print. Church of Our Lady would allow us to continue to use their copy machine for a donation of \$500.00. A motion was made to approve this expenditure. The motion was seconded. Discussion recommended such things as e-mail only, but not everyone has e-mail. 69 members currently get e-mail copies. Close to 400 are distributed by mail. Hand delivery at Seton was also suggested to save on postage. A fund raiser just for the newsletter was also recommended. The motion was tabled until the budget could be reviewed.
- **Tomato Festival is coming up— Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>;** we are looking for 4<sup>th</sup> degrees to participate. Meet at CVS Pharmacy in Reynoldsburg @ 1:30.
- **5<sup>th</sup> Sunday is on the 29<sup>th</sup> of August at Our Lady of Perpetual Help** Grove City at 9:30. Assemble at 9:00. Commander or Vice Commander will be in place.
