OUR GIFT EXCHANGE

(Who will go home with the helmet and the plate)?

After our December meeting, we will have our Christmas gift exchange. Each person is asked to bring a gift to exchange – a man should bring a man's gift and a lady should bring a lady's gift. When you arrive and present your gift, you will be given a number. That number will be very important to the exchange. A corresponding number will be put into a basket and when your number is drawn, you will be able to choose a gift from all the packages. **Before you open it**, you must decide whether you want to keep it or exchange it for one that has already been chosen and opened. (This option cannot apply to the first man or the first woman chosen as there will be no opened gifts). If someone takes your gift, you have the option of keeping what they gave you or again exchanging it for someone else's. However, **you can only exchange a gift three times during the course of the exchange.**

Why is this important? It gives us a chance to obtain the **coveted gifts** – the **helmet** for one of the Knights and **Crystal's plate** for one of the women. **Just because you chose that gift does not mean you will go home with it.** This makes the exchange interesting and fun. And **things can change several times** during the evening. A TRIP TO CAREY

The Sir Knights of Assembly 809 are starting to make plans for a trip to Our Lady of Consolation Shrine in Carey, Ohio. We are thinking about tentative dates of Saturday, March 25th, or Saturday, April 8th, which is the Saturday before Palm Sunday. We plan to go in a group by coach bus that will hold 47 passengers. 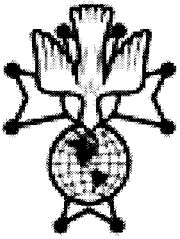
