## NEEDED: ITEMS FOR OUR AUCTIONS

An explanation of the auctions follows:

### SILENT AUCTION

This auction is for items of some worth. When you bring your item in, please have a value listed and what you think the minimum bid should be. If no one makes the minimum bid through the course of the evening, you will be given the opportunity to accept a lower bid or to take the item back.

Bids will be made on a piece of paper provided by the Assembly Ladies. It will have lines for several bids. Once you have made a bid for an item, you need to keep checking to see if someone has topped your bid..

If so, you have the option of bidding again. At the close of the evening, the person with the highest bid listed will get the item upon receipt of the price.

### CHINESE AUCTION

This auction is for items of lesser worth.

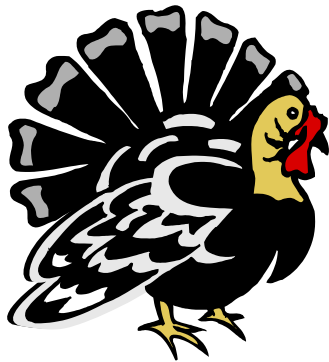
Instead of making bids for these items, you will be given an opportunity to buy tickets (50 cents each or 3 tickets for \$1.00). Then you can put all or part of the tickets you purchased in the container in front of the item. At the end of the evening, a ticket will be drawn from each of the containers and the person holding the matching ticket will get the item.

In other words, you could buy 3 tickets and put all three tickets in one container and/or you could put 2 in one and 1 in another, or one in each of three containers.

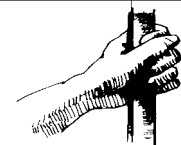

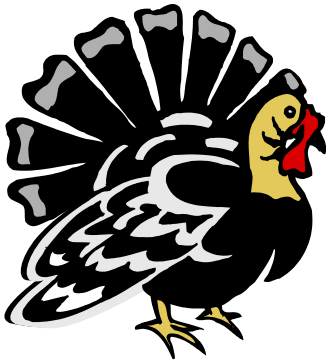
