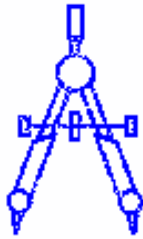

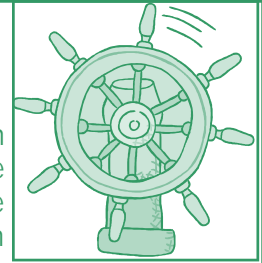

January's Potluck will simply be a cake and some ice cream (supplied by the Captain's table) for the baby shower. So eat before you come; you will only get dessert.

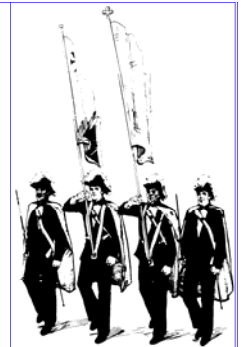

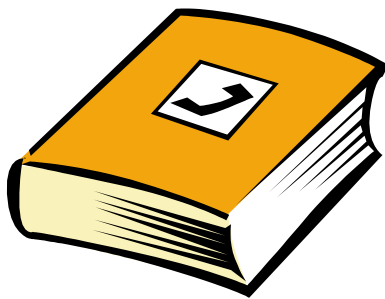
- * The 3rd Thursday of each month is the Social and Business meeting of the Assembly.
