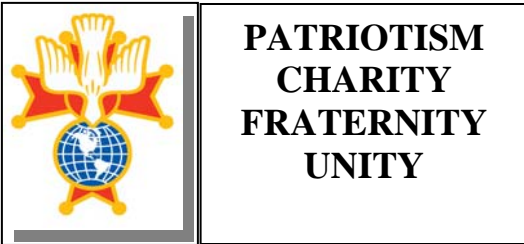

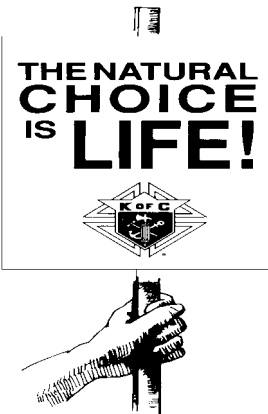

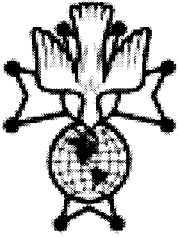
ASSEMBLY 809 MEETING'S TIME AND LOCATION
