September 21, 2006 Meeting opened 8:05 P.M. by the Faithful Navigator

**Roll Call of the officers, present:** Faithful Friar, Faithful Navigator, Faithful Admiral, Faithful Scribe, Faithful Inner Sentinel, Faithful Outer Sentinel, Faithful Trustee 1st year, Faithful Trustee 2nd year, Faithful Trustee 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

**The Faithful Captain position still remains open – the assembly needs your help! Larry James has stepped forward to take the Captain's position, but first we must find a replacement for the Comptroller position.**

**Reading of the Minutes:** There were no corrections to the minutes and a motion was made to suspend the reading of the minutes and to accept them as published. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion.

**Friar's Report:** The Holy Father's Academic Address in Bavaria was taken out of context by the press. Father encouraged us to read the address as presented in the Catholic Times. The pope's role is to be a teacher of the Catholic Church, rather than a diplomat. His theological approach is of the Dominican image of the work of grace to restore the image of God – love is not violent. The pope's address was to discuss the image of God to man and correlation to violence. Father also shared a letter from the Bishop. In the letter the bishop praised the work that Saint Paul's Outreach organization is having. Through their deep devotions and study, they have had 2 years of success in Columbus. There are 15 men living at Holy Name at Patterson. They provide an environment of prayer and focus on the sacraments. Their 2nd annual banquet is to be held at 6:00 PM, Sunday, October 1<sup>st</sup> at the Clarion Hotel in Columbus. A seat at a table costs \$50.00. Father encouraged us to attend since it is to foster the growth of the religious and it is one of the bishop's most favorite programs.

**The following bills were read and referred:** Liability Insurance yearly premium is due: motion was made for the bill to be presented to the trustees for their consideration. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion.

- **Pilot's Report:** A report of the events to be held in October and November was handed out. Don't forget the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday at OLPH on 29<sup>th</sup> October and 31<sup>st</sup> December.
- **Captain's Report:** no report was given.
- **Admiral's Report:** no new members to read and there will be a one-day exemplification degree held in Marion on 10/28.
- **Purser's Report:** All account balances were presented at the meeting and the report was placed in the book of the minutes of the meeting.
- **Comptroller's Report:** Bi-Laws changes were presented and are to be published and reviewed. Voted on at the next meeting. A fundraiser was proposed for a raffle to last for 20 weeks. A layout of the raffle was presented. First turn in will be in December.
- **Scribe's Report:** no report given.

## Marietta Exemplification – October 28th

There will be a District Three October Exemplification in Marietta, Ohio on Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. Information can be found on web at <http://www.kofcoho.org/master/district%203%20exempt.htm>. The Assembly 809 and 2900, as well as the Master Web site, have links to this information, which includes reservation forms, schedules and waiver request form. Below is a letter describing the requirements and specifications for the Marietta Exemplification.

### Worthy Sir Knights, Candidates, and Ladies,

Everyone, men and women, will meet at the Marietta K of C Hall for coffee and doughnuts at Marietta Council 478 Hall on Saturday, October 28, 2006 from 8:00 - 9:00 AM. The men will stay at the K of C Hall. Plans for the women include a special tour at the Campus Martius Museum and a Women's luncheon at Brighter Day Natural Foods.

An Exemplification has been scheduled for Saturday, October 28, 2006, at the Marietta Council Hall, 301 Gilman Street, Marietta, Ohio. The host Assembly will be Bishop J. Hartley Assembly, No.0840. The initiation costs are \$65.00 per candidate, which includes: (1) member fees to Supreme, (2) member pin (3) social baldric, and (4) the candidate's banquet meal.

There is no charge for a priest who is being exemplified. The sponsoring Assembly shall collect candidates' dues and wives' banquet costs for their Assembly. Any candidate for the Fourth Degree must be a paid-up member of the Third Degree in good standing, and must have been a member of the Order for at least 1 year.

Third Degree Members of the Order for six months or more (but less than 1 year) may apply in writing to the Master for a waiver. The Master will forward the request to the Supreme Master for approval. The waiver request must contain all necessary information, and must be received ASAP in order to allow time for processing.

Dress regulations for the candidates will remain as spelled out in the drill manual: black tuxedo, knife-pleated shirt with lay-down collar, black bow tie, black cummerbund, black shoes and socks, and white gloves. In addition, all candidates must have a sword and service baldric for the ceremony on Saturday. If they do not have them, the sponsor must make arrangements for them to be provided for the candidate.

Applications for membership must be completely filled out, including member number, name and location of his Council and future Assembly, and be signed by the candidate, Navigator, Comptroller and Financial Secretary of his Third Degree Council.
