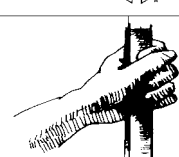

FALL EXEMPLIFICATION

There will be a one-day, 4th degree Exemplification on Saturday, November 10, 2007, in Lancaster, Ohio. It will be held at the Lancaster Council 1016 Council Hall, 343 East Walnut Street, Lancaster, Ohio, 43130. It will start at 9:00 AM and should be over by 8:00 PM.

The Candidates fee will be \$70.00 (includes Exemplification and Master's Banquet); an additional \$10.00 for a class picture and sack lunch). Brother Sir Knights and Guests will be charged #35.00.

CANDIDATES DRESS REQUIREMENTS:

Black tuxedo, (no tails), White tux shirt (no wing collar), Black bow tie and cummerbund, black socks, black dress shoes, military baldric, white gloves and Knights sword (contact SK Charles Giametta @ 864-8414 to buy sword at reduced price or purchase it from Supreme, Lynch & Kelly or the English Company)

QUALIFICATION GUIDE:

Any candidate for the Fourth Degree must be a paid up member of the Third Degree in good standing and must have been a member of the Order for at least 1 year. Third Degree members of the Order for six months * or more (but less than 1 year) may apply in writing to the Master for a waiver. The Master will forward the request to the Supreme Master for approval. The waiver request must contain the necessary information and must be received three weeks prior (by October 19th) in order to allow time for processing. There is no guarantee that any waiver requests received after that date would be honored.

- Must have made their 1st degree by May 10, 2007 and have completed the 2nd/3rd Degrees before taking the 4th Degree charges.
