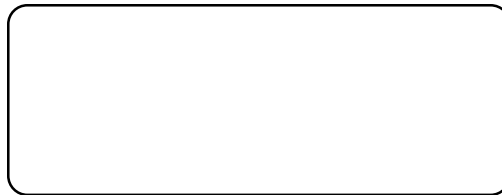

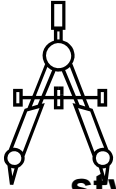

Assembly Announcement

The comptroller position is now vacant due to a resignation. Nominations will take place at the next regularly scheduled business meeting and elections will occur at the normal business meeting in December.

The Assembly voted to change the meeting location for the regularly scheduled business meeting on November 17, 2005 to Resurrection Parish. All other times and activities remain the same.

Third District of Ohio

Columbian Martyrs Assembly 2380 welcomes Sir Knight Francesco Iannaggi, Master of the Third District of Ohio

The Third District of Ohio Meeting is Sunday, November 13, 2005 at 2:00 pm. The location will be Seton Parish, 600 Hill Road North in Pickerington. The meeting will last 1.5 hours. This is a formal dress function. Chair officers are strongly encouraged to attend and all officers are encouraged to attend.

There will be a follow-on meeting District meeting in March 2006.

The Navigator must advise the Master of all activities of the Assembly on a monthly and special circumstance basis. This includes parades, Masses, wakes, events, etc. The Master will notify the Navigator of any activity that may not be carried out by the Assembly.

The District is putting together an Exemplification Team. This will be a four-year commitment to this team. The first opportunity to function as a District Team will be in Marietta, Ohio in October 2006. This team consists of several speaking parts and numerous behind-the-scenes personnel. This includes the setup and takedown groups. Electricians, sound personnel and carpenters are needed. Sir Knights wishing to be part of the Exemplification Team should notify the Navigator of their

desire **prior to November 13**. The Cincinnati Exemplification Team is willing to loan their equipment while the Third District acquires their own equipment. The Steubenville Diocese also has an Exemplification Team. Their team is short some key members due to age, illness and infirmity. The Master is required to use the Exemplification Team in his District if he has such a Team.

The Columbus Diocese exemplification will be May 19-21, 2006 at Hilton Hotel in Easton. The candidate cost is \$65.00. This price is set by Supreme and it must include the cost of the dinner, the fourth degree pin and the social baldric.

Columbus Bishop Herrmann 2727 and Pope John Paul II 2900 Assemblies are responsible for the registration at the Exemplification.

Columbian Martyrs Assembly 2380 is responsible for the Mass on May 20, 2005. The principle celebrant is the District Friar, Father John Bakle. The Assembly is looking for a committee to work with Father to plan the music, liturgy, and all other functions associated with the celebration of the Mass. Father Bakle is the final approval and veto authority. The Navigator needs the names prior to November 13 for the District Meeting.

There is a need for a Committee for the Ladies Program. Over the past years, the District has had entertainers, puppeteers, dance instructors, and other types of entertainment.

The Advertisement Book Sales are critical for a successful Exemplification. The book needs to generate \$8-10K this year to cover costs. Sales by the Assembly of \$1,250 provide us with payment of one night of the Hospitality Room. Sales of \$1,500 by the Assembly provide us one night of the Hospitality Room and one night for the Captain's room. Sales by the Assembly for \$2,000 provide us one night of the Hospitality Room and two nights of a hotel room. Ad cost \$100 for a whole page, \$50 per half and \$25 per quarter page. There are ten councils with direct reporting to this Assembly. This should generate \$1,000 of ads.

The Third District is developing a composite Color Corp Team for presentation and retiring the colors for official functions. Tryouts for the Team will be announced later. This team will be responsible for all Flag ceremonies at the Exemplification.

Columbian Martyrs Assembly never paid for the one night of the Hospitality Room in April 2005. The Assembly needs to pay \$100 to the Masters Fund for this room. There may not have been a bill sent to the Assembly for this room. Instead the Assembly needed to pay for its use. Is there a motion to pay this debt?

There is a need for all officers to take part in events. They need to mentor new Sir Knights and be members of committees.

The Assembly is eligible for the Civic Award. The Civic Award calls for at least four varied patriotic programs held within the fraternal year. This Assembly participated at the wreath laying ceremony at the Christopher Columbus statue. We will have lunch and present the Colors at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Chillicothe on November 5. We will participate in the Veterans Day Parade in Columbus on November 10. We have Sir Knights that make presentations to Catholic high school classes in conjunction with the Catholic War Veterans. The Columbus Chapter meeting on December 1 will feature the Veterans Administration coordinator for the Chalmers P. Wylie Clinic as its guest speaker. The Master feels all Assemblies should attain this award.

Vice Supreme Master George Mallison made this statement to his Worthy Masters, "We (Fourth Degree) are part of, not apart from, the Third Degree."

Hennepin Province

Vice Supreme Master George Mallison and his staff have completed the transition to the current leadership.

The Vice Supreme Master and all six Masters from Michigan and Ohio have determined the following from the Supreme Master's letter dated May 23, 2005 to all Sir Knights.

- There will be no flags, fourth degree pins, jewels, medals or any other adornments to full regalia. The Supreme Master is developing a new flag pin for use with full regalia.
- Only the Fourth Degree pin given to Knights of Columbus at their Exemplification may be worn with the Formal Dress. No large Fourth Degree pins or jewel-encrusted pins are permitted.

- The service and social baldrics shall be in the appropriate national colors. The Knights of Columbus emblem shall be vertical when worn. The older style baldric with the Knights of Columbus emblem parallel to the appropriate national colors is no longer authorized for wear.
- The cape shall be a black cape with a liner of the appropriate color for the office held with a Fourth Degree patch on the shoulder. The patch will not have a black background and no other devices or patches will be worn with the cape.

The Pilot is the Flag Protocol Officer. He is responsible for the proper display of the Flag at all Fourth Degree functions.

The next Hennepin Provincial meeting is September 30 and October 1, 2006.
