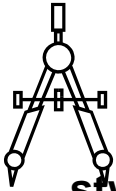

Being a Catholic Gentlemen in these times

The Fifth through Tenth Commandments tell us what we "shall not" do. It appears that we are being told how to behave through "negative" commands. In reality God is teaching us how to live out, in concrete ways, the second "greatest commandment" taught by Jesus: "Love thy neighbor as thyself". If we break one of these commandments, we hurt our neighbor and ourselves by our actions. We are our neighbors' keeper and, like ourselves, they are made in the image and likeness of God. We are responsible for giving of ourselves in a loving and unconditional manner to our neighbors as God willed. Many times, however, the effects of original sin and our choice to follow our own will cause us to give to others for partially selfish reasons, or to seek our own reward. This is not true giving; this is bartering. When people barter, they try to gain an advantage over other people. Do we, as humans, want to be second? The usual answer from human nature affected by sin is "no". The act of coveting also shows our desire to be better than another. We covet what others have without wanting to invest the time and sacrifice they put into their relationships and work. Sometimes our lack of love for and self-giving to our neighbors who image God is so intense that we may wish them killed. But if we truly follow Christ's second greatest commandment by the concrete ways given in the Fifth to Tenth Commandments, we will truly give of ourselves and will show others our love and devotion to God and His only beloved Son, Jesus Christ.
