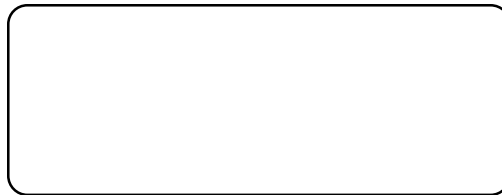

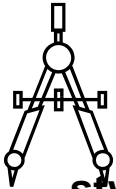

This participation does not mean we are earning salvation, but rather co-operating with God's grace. This capacity to co-operate makes us more humble and dependent upon the Lord, rather than reaching a point in life where we can make it upon our own. There is nothing we can do to merit salvation for ourselves."
