Greetings Sir Knights and Ladies,

There was a new directive issued that stated no swords were to be drawn, or any other actions take during the Act of Consecration that may draw attention away from the act of Consecration itself which is and always should be the focal point of the Mass. In addition, the District Master has requested that

no swords will be drawn when acting as escorts for the gifts during the Mass. Instead the Knights acting as escorts will carry their Chapeaus over their hearts. When receiving Holy Communion, Sir Knights will now remove their Chapeau and gloves and leave them at their seat. In this way, we may now receive both the Body and the Blood of Christ.

Just as a reminder, the dress code for formal attire suggests plain shoes without tassels or other adornments. All knights should wear the same lapel pin (without flag).

As members of the Patriotic Order, we have no greater duty than to participate in the electoral process which determines our political leadership. As a minimum we need to do the research to determine what candidates support the views that we value and to cast our vote for them. In this national election we face choices that will determine the future of many things that are morally important to us as Catholics including abortion, the institution of marriage, and the continued right of religious leaders to preach values that they feel are appropriate. Please think about these issues seriously and don't just cast your vote based on your traditional support for one party or another. Note that the Knights of Columbus is devoting considerable effort to encourage us to vote Pro-Life. Please recognize a hierarchy of values, with the need for life issues to be pre-eminent over all others. We cannot help the poor if we have eliminated them before birth or euthanized them at the end of their lives. Nearly a million babies are aborted each year. The next target on the liberal social agenda is euthanasia for those of advanced age (many of us in the 4th Degree), the crippled, the lame, and those with special needs. This election could well change the direction of the United States for the rest of our lifetimes, and not in a positive direction. Vote for life and pray that God helps us to make the right choice!

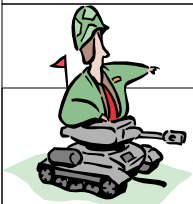

Of Interest...

Roasted Chicken Pieces with Potatoes & Ginger-Soy Glaze

Adapted from recipe published in October 2008 *Good Housekeeping*

2 T olive oil
1 T honey
4 t grated ginger
3 T reduced-sodium soy sauce
1 (4 lb) cut-up chicken (8 pieces) with skin removed from all but wings
1 1/2 lbs sweet potatoes (2 large), peeled and cut into 1 1/2 in. chunks
1 medium onion, cut into 8 wedges

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Spray 15 1/2 x 10 1/2 jelly roll pan with non stick cooking spray.

In large bowl, stir together oil, honey, ginger, and 1 T soy sauce. Add chicken, sweet potatoes, and onion and toss until coated.

Arrange chicken mixture in prepared pan. Roast 30 to 35 minutes or until juices run clear when thickest part of chicken is pierced with tip of knife. Transfer chicken mixture to warm platter. Drizzle with remaining soy sauce. Serve with pan juices

Serves 4

Notes from the Santini Kitchen: We made several changes to this recipe when we made it our home.

We used 1 T olive oil and 2 t sesame oil. Instead of a cut up chicken, we used 3 lbs of boneless, skinless chicken thighs that we chunked into pieces. Since Jon doesn't like sweet potatoes, we used regular potatoes. We also put all 3 T of soy sauce in the bowl and mixed with the other sauce ingredients.

If you haven't noticed, we hardly use a recipe without making some change. Jon and I both thoroughly enjoyed this dish. We agree that if you roasted just the chicken and the onion without the potatoes that it would be excellent served over some hot steamed rice.

Feast of All Saints

The earliest certain observance of a feast in honor of all the saints is an early fourth-century commemoration of "all the martyrs." In the early seventh century, after successive waves of invaders plundered the catacombs, Pope Boniface IV gathered up some 28 wagonloads of bones and reinterred them beneath the Pantheon, a Roman temple dedicated to all the gods. The Pope rededicated the shrine as a Christian church. According to Venerable Bede, the pope intended "that the memory of all the saints might in the future be honored in the place which had formerly been dedicated to the worship not of gods but of demons" (*On the Calculation of Time*).

But the rededication of the Pantheon, like the earlier commemoration of all the martyrs, occurred in May. Many Eastern Churches still honor all the saints in the spring, either during the Easter season or immediately after Pentecost.

How the Western Church came to celebrate this feast in November is a puzzle to historians. The Anglo-Saxon theologian Alcuin observed the feast on November 1 in 800, as did his friend Arno, Bishop of Salzburg. Rome finally adopted that date in the ninth century.
