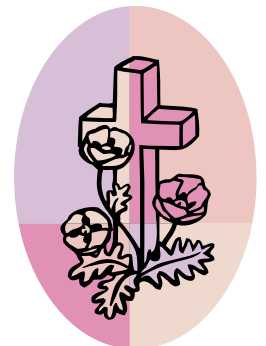

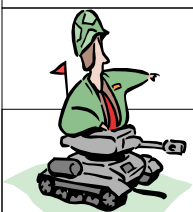
Thanks to the Sir Knights and Ladies who attended the October Social at Digger & Finch. We had a great time.
