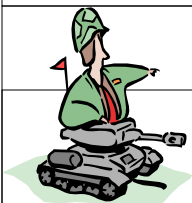

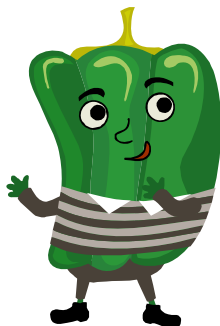
As always, keep an eye on the calendar for upcoming events. It's kind of tough to be a Commander if there is no one to Command!

# Of Interest...

## Stuffed Peppers

4 large to extra large green peppers  
 1 pound ground beef  
 2 Italian sausage links  
 1/2 to 1 C Italian seasoned bread crumbs  
 1/2 C jarred spaghetti sauce (for meat mix)  
 Lea & Perrin's Worcestershire sauce  
 Italian Seasoning  
 Minced onion flakes  
 Minced garlic  
 Parmesan cheese, grated



Wash and "gut" peppers and place in a casserole dish. In large bowl, combine ground beef, sausage links removed from casings, bread crumbs (go by feel), spaghetti sauce. The remaining seasonings can be added to your personal tastes; I did not use any measurements. Mix meat mixture until well mixed.

Place equal amounts of meat mixture into the peppers. We like to spoon additional spaghetti sauce over the top of the peppers before baking. Shake on some parmesan cheese if you like.

Bake at 350 for at least 1 hour or until meat mixture is no longer pink the middle.

*Notes from the Santini Kitchen:* This is a recipe that Jodi created last week. There were really no measurements used for this recipe but I tried to offer some as a guide. The recipe was inspired by a great sale on peppers at Kroger with some nice, large peppers perfect for stuffed peppers.

## Provincial Meeting Highlights

1. Veterans of the armed forces may render a hand salute to the flag while reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Non-veterans should place their hand over their heart during the pledge.
2. The Pledge is to be recited as it was originally modified through the efforts of the Knights of Columbus in 1954. That is, it will end with the phrase: "with liberty and justice for ALL." The addition of the phrase "born and unborn" is not part of the pledge and is not to be added, per the instructions of the Supreme Knight. "All" in fact is quite sufficient, as it includes all Americans, born and unborn, elderly and handicapped, rich and poor, man and woman, and all races, religions and creeds.
3. We as Knights have a primary responsibility to support the clergy and to give them the respect and cooperation that they deserve. From time to time we may have a disagreement with a member of the clergy. However, that never gives us the right to treat them with anything other than respect. They are the representative of Christ on earth, and we should treat them as such. In a parish, the Pastor is the final authority and we need to recognize that. Disrespect for any member of the clergy is grounds for dismissal from our Order.
4. Show respect for the clergy by standing and acknowledging them whenever they enter the Council or Assembly meeting place. This sign of respect should also be shown to Masters, Former Masters and State Officers.
5. Meetings need to be formalized to the extent that Knights always stand and salute the Grand Knight or the Navigator when addressing them. It must be remembered that we are not a men's club, but an organization that has ceremonies and protocols that distinguish our order and should be uniform throughout all jurisdictions. Protocols are not an optional formality, but an important part of what makes us what we are.
6. When receiving Holy Communion while in regalia, Knights will leave their gloves and chapeaus in the pew and receive communion in their hand.
