Registration of Candidates begins at 8:30AM All candidates, Sir Knights and Guest must be present by 9:30AM. Exemplification Mass will be held at St. John the Baptist Church, 17784 State Route 676, Marietta, Ohio at 4:00 PM. Social hour begins following Mass and the Masters Banquet begins at 6:30PM in Council 478 Hall.

Fee for the Candidates will be \$70.00 for the Exemplification which includes Supreme fees, Social Baldric, Membership Pin, and Masters Banquet. The cost for guests (*candidates Lady, Sir Knights, family members and friends*) to attend the Masters Banquet is \$25.00. 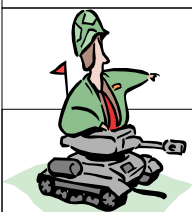

Peppermint-Lavender Iced Tea



1 to 2 drops of peppermint essential oil such as Young Living
