Greetings Sir Knights and Ladies,

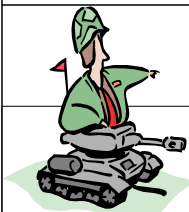

Exemplification Mass will be held at St. John the Baptist Church, 17784 State Route 676, Marietta, Ohio at 4:00 PM. Social hour begins following Mass and the Masters Banquet begins at 6:30PM in Council 478 Hall.
