The nurse was caring for the other lady and heard us through the curtain and said “Go ahead and wake her Father. She’s sleeping most of the time and really could use the visit.” So I said, “Viola, Alleluia, Happy Easter”. The nurse responded, “You’re late Father.” I replied, “I know, we had to visit Chimes Terrace and see a whole lot of folks over there.” “No, No”, said the nurse, “I mean Easter was last Sunday.” I interrupted, “No we celebrate Easter for 50 days and 50 nights.” The nurse said, “I’ve never heard that before, I’m going to send an Easter card.” The celebration continues in our knowing, living and sharing the Good news of Our Risen Savior.

I’ll give you an example. Last Saturday night at the 5:30 p.m. Mass we continued our celebration of Easter. The Mass was for the sanctification of Father McGivney and we had Brother Knights in full regalia – just seeing these good men brings joy to my heart and to the hearts of most people. I just returned from visiting a rehab center where Mr. John Colopy had a hip replaced – 88 years of age and doing great. Upon my return, my fearless secretary, Kathy told me Mark Steele called and I had this article to do. (Please pray for Kathy’s mother-in-law; she’s ready to meet the Lord.)

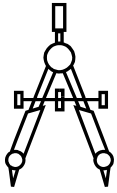



Knights of Columbus Launches Informational Web Site on Pope's Visit to the United States

The Knights of Columbus has launched a new Web site aimed at keeping people up to date on Pope Benedict XVI's visit to the United States next month. The Catholic Cable Network EWTN is cosponsoring the site.

The site, www.papaltrip.com, provides a variety of interactive items related to the pope's itinerary, the [history of the papacy and the United States](#), and also features regular news updates on the pope to allow people to familiarize themselves with this man and to follow the pope's journey to the United States more closely.

"We realize that there are far more people who would like to see the pope during this trip than will be able to do so," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson.

"We hope that this site will allow people to better understand the pope before his visit, and to follow closely his activities in the United States."

The site includes biographical information on the pope, links to his books and writings, a history of the popes and the United States, and news about the pope and his planned trip. The site will also feature prayers for the pope's trip, a blog, and live streaming coverage of papal events via EWTN.

Pope Benedict will be in the United States from April 15 to 20, 2008, visiting New York and Washington, D.C. EWTN is the global Catholic television network based in Irondale, Alabama.

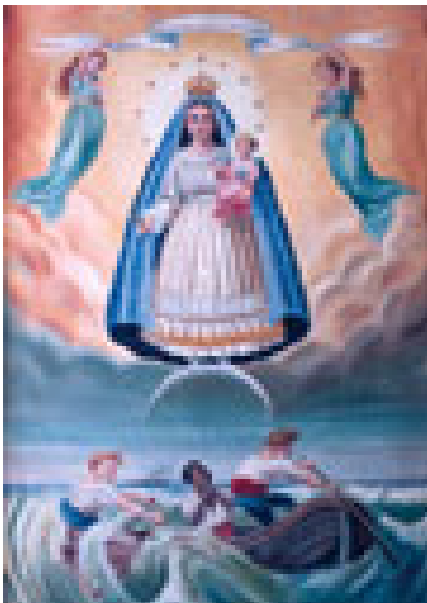

Spring 2008 Update

Sister Dorothy Stang was shot to death Saturday, February 12th, 2005, in Anapu, Para, a section of Brazil's Amazon Rainforest. She moved to Brazil over 40 years ago to help poor farmers build independent futures for their families. She was there with the Pastoral Land Commission, an organization of the Catholic Church that struggles for the rights of rural workers and peasants, and defends land reforms in Brazil.

Objective: To support the continuation of Sister Dorothy's mission in Brazil and education efforts in the United States as related to the challenges of living the call to Christian discipleship in today's Global Society.

Question: What can we do as Knights of Columbus, Catholics and citizens of our Global Community to continue the efforts of Sister Dorothy and the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur?

Answer: We will continue to spread the word of our Savior Jesus Christ, we will defend and assist the poor, we will protect our God given environment for the good of all, and seek justice for victims of violence and atrocities.

Question: Will we come to the defense of a Catholic Nun who was murdered in cold blood?

Answer: **YES!!!** We must stand in solidarity with our priests, nuns and all of our worldwide church family when they come under attack throughout our world.

Project Observations: This is not just someone's "pet project". This project brings attention directly to the unacceptable violence and atrocities that are happening throughout our world every day. This is not another way of celebrating Earth Day / Arbor Day. This is a way to reconcile with God, each other, our global environment and the poor and less fortunate of the world.

Plan of Action

- 1) Pray the Rosary in the name of all victims of violence.
- 2) Plant a Dorothy Tree / Reconciliation Tree.
